  18. 1996-2001 - I studied three larger topics in parallel; the peasant society's transformation after 1945, the Hungarian cultural history of the era 1948-1989, and the social history of Hungary in the second half of the 20th century. In the period between 1999 and 2001, I worked on the manuscript of my book: "Hungarian Social History in the second part of the 20th century," which was published in 2001, and received three new editions. It was also published in English in the „Social History of Hungary” with the cooperation of Gábor Gyáni and György Kövér.
  19. 1995-1997 - I was a researcher of an international project of the Cold War History Centre, Woodrow Wilson Centre and the '56 Institute which was intended to place 1956 in a global context.
  20. 1990-1996 - My research topic was the history of the revolution in 1956. During this period I studied the life story and the social structure of the revolutionists before and after 1956. These studies got in shape in my Ph.D. thesis in 1995, and transformed into a book in 1996.
  21. 1987-1994 - The history of the twentieth century Hungarian political thinking was my second important research project. As part of the project I edited the writings, essays of Imre Csécsy, Imre Kovács, Ferenc Donáth, Ruzssem Vámbéry. The results of this work were published between 1988 and 1994.
  22. 1984-1988 - From the middle of the 1980s I participated in historical and sociological researches in Homokmégy. The result of the research sufficiently shaped my first publication, which examined the structure of

the peasantry. This work reassessed the process of the collectivization, which liquidated the historical peasant society.
